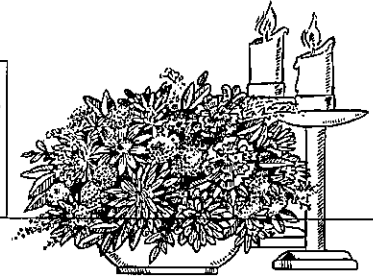


Altar Flowers & Candles

SCRIPTURE VERSE FOR THE WEEK:

Jesus said to them, "Follow me and I will make you fish for people." Mark 1:17 (NRSV)

A Prayer for the Week:

Lord Jesus, you who call us to follow you, we thank you for your steadfast love that gives us the courage and the faith to follow. Amen.

Mealttime Prayer:

For food and drink, house and home, we thank you God, you give them all. May we hear your voice and follow your call. Amen.

A Blessing to Give:

May the God who calls you to follow Jesus be your mighty rock, and your protection, now and always. (Mark 1:17 and Psalm 62:7)



DEVOTIONS

Read: Psalm 62:5-12 in the style of lectio divina (divine reading). This is a psalm of trust in God's power and steadfast love. Read the verses slowly twice, then pause to reflect on a word or phrase that stands out for you. Focus on that word or phrase for an extended time. What might be the significance of that word or phrase for you today? Read it again and wonder how this text may guide your life in the days ahead.
Pray: Read it a final time as a prayer, and conclude by praying the Lord's Prayer.

SERVICE

Simon, Andrew, James, and John left their jobs as fishermen to follow Jesus. They were now to be "fishers of people." Following Jesus sometimes means sacrificing, giving up, or sharing earthly goods to share Jesus' love and good news with others. Decide on an act of giving or sharing you can do this week as a way to promote the message and work of Christ for the sake of the world.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

The fish is an important Christian symbol. Each letter in the Greek spelling of the word "fish" (IXTHUS) begins a Greek word that stands for "Jesus Christ God Son Savior." During the early church, it was dangerous to be a Christian in some parts of the Roman Empire. Believers developed a code to reveal their faith to others who were Christian. One person would draw on the ground the upper half of a fish symbol. If the other person was a Christian, they would recognize this and add a second curve line to complete the drawing of a fish. Practice making the fish symbol with others by having two people make curved lines to create the fish symbol. Place the fish design in different parts of your home to symbolize and remind you of your faith in Jesus. Pray for those who live in places today where it is dangerous to be a Christian

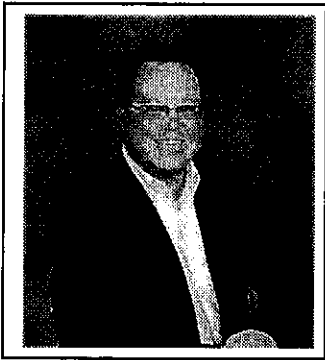
All pledging members—including their families—of Saint Joseph's are invited for dinner. Childcare will be offered following dinner. We will discuss the budget for 2018 and vote in new Vestry members. We ask that everyone attend this important meeting. Sign-up sheet is in the Parish Hall.

According to the By-laws of Saint Joseph's Episcopal Church, in addition to the rector, there are 9 vestry members who each serve 3-year terms. (The Head of Saint Joseph's Episcopal School functions as an additional non-voting member of Saint Joseph's Vestry.) To ensure continuity, the terms of the elected vestry members are on a tri-fold cycle. Every year the terms of 3 vestry members expire. No one can serve consecutive terms. The outgoing vestry members form the nominating committee for the 3 new vestry members, who will be elected at the annual parish meeting on Friday night, January 26th.

The canons of the Church determine the qualifications of electors as "communicant members in good standing who are 16 years of age and over, whose names are duly enrolled as such in the register of the said congregation, and who are regular in their attendance upon its services and make stated contributions of record to its general support."

If you feel called to nominate yourself as a candidate for vestry, please review the vestry liaison responsibilities as listed for our outgoing members. Nominations should be submitted to the Nominating Committee — the 3 outgoing vestry members: Paul Wegner, Sherry Thomas, and Rochelle Prince.

Those put forth by the Vestry for election are Marcos Boronat, Jane Mills, and Michael McLemore.



My name is Marcos Boronat and it would be a privilege to serve as a member of the Vestry at Saint Joseph's.

While there are easier ways to make a living, my vocation has been spiritually satisfying, helping those who cannot help themselves and bringing a small measure of peace to those left behind.

I have served on the Blessing of the Animals since 2012, been an usher and lector since then at the 7:45 service, participated in the Reveal Workshop and Discernment Committee, am an Ambassador for the Green Team, have assisted the Tech Ministry in multimedia presentations at 7:45, updated our landscaping along Swinton, have repaired or maintained office equipment or ice making machines saving the Church funds. I enjoy helping others and my talents have been welcomed.

Since joining Saint Joseph's, truly I have felt loved and challenged by this Church. I have been supported in difficult times, and felt love here. If my being on the Vestry is another way I can serve my family and make a positive difference, then I accept this privilege.

Wanda Brady introduced us to St. Joe's when Ray worked in her building complex. We've been members for 14 years.

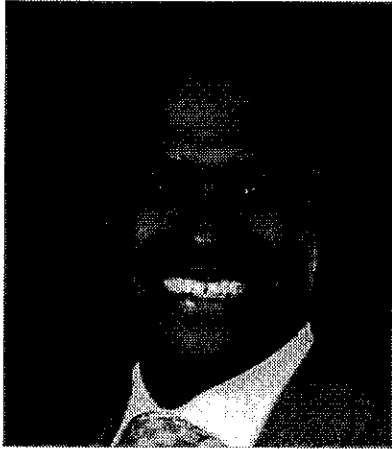

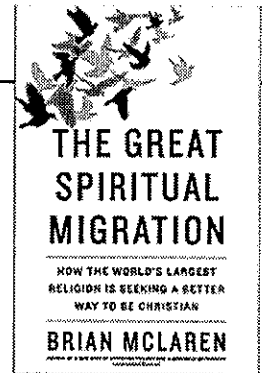
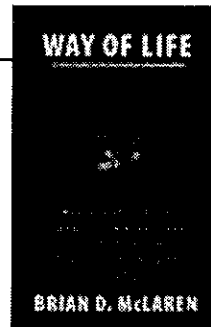
Lenten Small Group Series

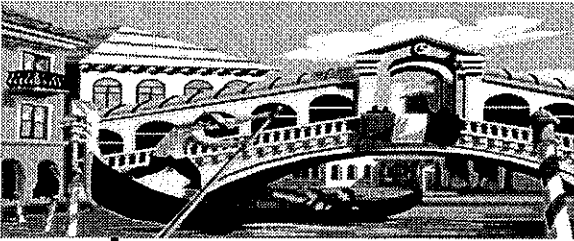
Way of Life,

In this series Brian invites us to seize the moment and set out on the most significant spiritual pilgrimage of our time: to help Christianity become more Christian. To quote Richard Rohr, "Anything written by Brian McLaren is always filled with insight, courage, and creative theology."

While it is not absolutely necessary to read the book in order to participate in our Lenten program, we recommend it as a preparation. 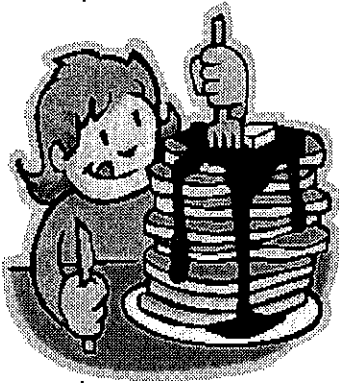

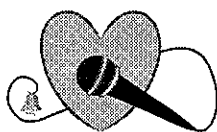

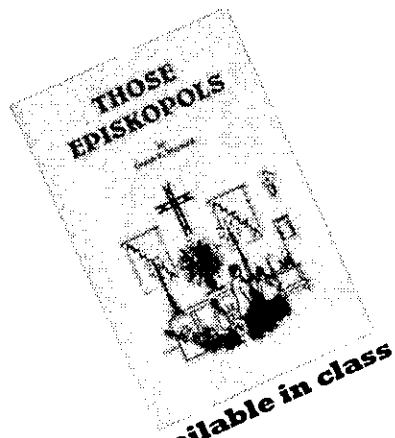
